BYLAW NO. 3-2018

**A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE PARKING OF TRAILERS, OTHER THAN SEMI-TRAILERS,
ON PUBLIC HIGHWAYS**

The Council of the Town of Delisle in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. (a) This Bylaw may be cited as "Trailer Parking Bylaw"; and
(b) this is to be read in conjunction with Bylaw 2-2009, "The Traffic Bylaw".

PURPOSE

2. The purpose of this Bylaw is to provide for the parking of Recreational vehicles and trailers on highways within the Municipal boundaries.

DEFINITIONS

3. In this Bylaw:
 - (a) "recreational vehicle" (RV)- means a self-propelled or towed vehicular type unit, primarily designed as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping or travel use, and which is used solely as a family or personal conveyance and in no way used for a commercial purpose. Without limiting the foregoing, recreational vehicles include:
 - (i) travel trailer;
 - (ii) cabin trailer;
 - (iii) tent trailer;
 - (iv) truck camper;
 - (v) motorhome;
 - (vi) park trailer; and
 - (vii) fifth-wheel travel trailer.
 - (b) "Trailers" means a flat deck trailer, enclosed cargo trailer, utility or recreation vehicle trailer, horse and livestock trailer, gooseneck (5th wheel trailers), or units deemed to be trailers by an Inspector.
4. Except as otherwise provided herein, the temporary parking of RV's and trailers, as defined in section 3 of this document, is permitted on all highways within the Municipality.
 - (a) **RECREATIONAL VEHICLE AND TRAILER PARKING ON HIGHWAYS**
 - (1) A recreational vehicle shall not be parked on a highway unless it is parked in a location completely adjoining the recreational vehicle owner's residence as shown in the records of the Motor Vehicle Registry.

- (2) Subject to the provisions of subsection (1), a recreational vehicle parked pursuant to this section:
- (a) shall not be parked for more than 48 consecutive hours;
 - (b) all slide outs on RV's shall only be extended outwards for the loading and/or unloading of the trailer;
 - (c) at no time shall slide outs impede vehicle traffic on highways or pedestrian traffic on sidewalks;
 - (d) shall be removed to an off-highway location for at least 48 consecutive hours before it may be parked again on a highway; and
 - (e) shall not have its sewage tank drained or be allowed to leak onto the highway.
 - (f) shall not be parked on municipally owned property.
- (3) A recreational vehicle parked on a highway shall not be occupied.

(b) RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND TRAILERS IN DRIVEWAYS AND/OR PARKING PADS

Any recreational vehicle or trailer parked on a front yard driveway or parking pad must be parked a minimum of 1.5 metres from the interior edge of the sidewalk, so as not to interfere with or cause a hazard for pedestrians using the sidewalk. If no sidewalk exists, the 1.5 metres will be from the curb.

(c) FRONT YARDS

Subject to section (b), all residential front yards regardless of whether they are landscaped or hardscaped shall be kept free of the following:

- a) motorized vehicles including, but not limited to, automobiles, snow mobiles, ATV's, etc.;
- b) recreational vehicles; and/or
- c) trailers of any type;

(d) UNATTACHED TRAILERS

All trailers not attached to a vehicle by which it may be drawn shall have its wheels properly caulked and have a sturdy pad under all jacks to ensure no damage occurs to the highway.

OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

5. No person shall:
 - (a) fail to comply with an order made pursuant to this bylaw;
 - (b) obstruct or interfere with any Designated Officer or any other person acting under the authority of this Bylaw; or
 - (c) fail to comply with any other provision of this Bylaw.

6. Where a Notice of Violation has been issued for an offence under this Bylaw, the owner or operator of a vehicle that is unlawfully placed or kept on any street, parking place or other public place is subject to an additional fine after the elapse of Twelve hours from the time the previous Notice of Violation was issued for that offence.

7. A person who contravenes any part of this Bylaw or fails to comply therewith or with any notice or order thereunder shall be guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be liable for a fine of \$ 50.00

8. Anyone found in contravention of this bylaw, upon being served with a Notice of Violation, may, during regular office hours, voluntarily pay the penalty at the Municipal Office, and upon payment as so provided, that person shall not be liable to prosecution of the offence.

9. Voluntary payment within 10 days of the issuance of a Notice of Violation for a penalty levied under this bylaw will reduce the penalty to 50% of the original amount.

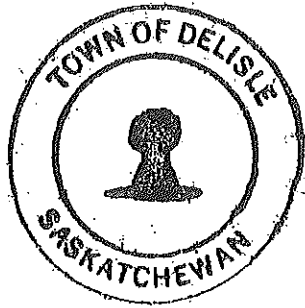
IMPOUNDING

10. (a) The police, a special constable or any other person appointed by council may remove or cause to be removed any vehicle that is unlawfully placed, left or kept on any street or lane, public parking place, or other public place, or on municipally owned property, and accordingly such person shall have the authority to impound and/or store such vehicle.

(b) Where a vehicle has been impounded or stored after it has been removed under subsection (a), it may be retained at a place designated by council for a period of thirty (30) days from date of removal unless the cost of removal, impounding and/or storage are paid sooner. Upon payment of the full costs herein, the vehicle may be released to the owner thereof.

(c) If the costs of removal, impounding and storage are not paid within the period of thirty days as specified in subsection (b), the municipality shall have the right to recover same from the owner of the vehicle by:

- (1) legal action in a court of competent jurisdiction;
- (2) sale by public auction on publication of a notice designating the time and place of a sale at least 14 days prior to the sale in a newspaper circulating in the municipality and on sending such notice by registered mail to the owner at the address appearing on the last registration of the vehicle

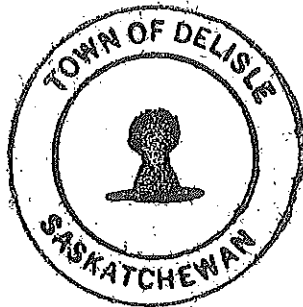
